The Great Collapse: America Stops Believing the Media

Gallup's new survey just delivered a thunderclap.

Only **8 percent** of Americans say they have a *great deal* of trust in national media, and only **20 percent** say they have even a *fair amount*. Everyone else? They're done.

You already knew confidence was low. You probably didn't know *how* low — or how far the media have fallen.

When the Media Research Center launched in 1987, nearly three out of four (75 percent!) Americans trusted the news they watched or read. Journalists were seen as referees, not players. The country counted on them to keep score honestly, to call the fouls when power crossed a line, and to protect the public from manipulation. Their authority rested on fairness. Once they chose sides, they forfeited the trust that came with it.

Today, the press polls below nearly... well... everything. The media once topped the list of trusted institutions. Now it's scraping the bottom. Only Congress fares worse.

Think about that: an industry built entirely on credibility now ranks below Congress in public trust.

How did it happen? Not overnight. Headline by headline. Scandal by scandal. Smear by smear.

The collapse of trust began the moment journalists stopped describing events and started defining them. The shift was subtle at first — adjectives replacing facts, framing overtaking reporting. By the 1990s, newsroom objectivity had given way to storytelling with an agenda.

Selective editing turned into selective reality. The socalled "mainstream media" began guarding one side of the political field and biting only at the other. Every institution they disfavored — faith, family, law enforcement, capitalism — was treated as suspect. Every progressive cause, no matter how extreme, was cast as a moral duty.

And then came the era of character assassination. Honest disagreement wasn't debated, it was delegitimized. Conservatives weren't just wrong; we were dangerous. When "fact-checkers" became the final arbiters of truth, dissent was reclassified as *misinformation*.

They called it journalism. The country called it propaganda.

Outrage became the business model. Conflict was no longer a byproduct of news; it was the news. That's when trust began to crater.

Every sensational chyron, every anonymous leak, every political hit piece widened the gap between the press and the people it claimed to serve. Americans have learned to expect the distortion — and eventually, to ignore it.

But here's what the media won't admit: you did this.

Your support for the Media Research Center made it possible to hold the press accountable, clip by clip, study by study, year after year. You gave the country proof. You gave the movement receipts. You helped millions of Americans see the patterns for themselves.

The watchdog barked — and America heard us loud and clear.

For decades, the media operated like an untouchable class, confident they could frame every story to fit their agenda. Then came the MRC — and our supporters — who refused to let them get away with it.

Now, the mask is off. The public sees the press for what it is: a political machine pretending to be journalism. The collapse in media trust is confirmation for us at MRC.

Americans are hungry for honest storytelling, real reporting, and information that treats them like adults. The market for truth is wide open, and MRC is ready to meet it.

Our team is expanding across every platform to make sure no narrative goes unchecked. We're not waiting for legacy media to fail; we're building what comes after it.

Everything we've built — the monitoring, the data, the discipline of proof — now defines the standard for credibility that the national press abandoned. The public no longer takes their word for it; they come looking for evidence. And we have it.

Our job now is simple: Keep producing the receipts, keep expanding the reach, and keep reminding the country the media cannot be trusted.

CHARLIE KIRK: Free Speech Warrior

Charlie Kirk was a lot of things—leader of young people to faith and family, outstanding organizer, policy entrepreneur and talented debater. But he also was a tremendous advocate for free speech, and MRC Free Speech America produced a short report that explains it all.

"7 Times Charlie Kirk Spoke His Mind on Free Speech" provides a comprehensive and, sadly, prophetic view of how Kirk valued freedom of speech. Here are the seven:

- ★ "When people stop talking, that's when you get violence," said Kirk in an interview with Megyn Kelly that was pulled from the MRC archives. "... Marriages break apart when you stop talking. Churches fall apart. And I think what makes this country on the verge of going to a place we don't want it to go right now is we're afraid to go places like this and have these conversations."
- ★ Kirk made the argument for allowing even so-called hate speech. "As soon as you shut up 'hate speech,' those people only get more powerful," Kirk said on a podcast with Donald Trump Jr.
- ★ Kirk believed that "hate speech" is and should be protected. "Every day people say, you know, 'Well someone should go kill Charlie Kirk,' he said. "I don't like it, but that's protected speech. In America, we care about what you do, not about what you say."
- ★ Kirk said "Elon Musk liberating Twitter will go down as one of the greatest free speech victories in the history of

- Western Civilization. One of the reasons why the powerful are getting nervous is because we can finally speak again online."
- In another, he took on an issue in the UK where a woman was on the verge of being sentenced to 2 ½ years in prison for a tweet about a migrant hotel that she apologized for and deleted. Kirk again said hate speech is free speech. "You should be allowed to say outrageous things," Kirk said. "You should be allowed to say contrarian things. Free speech is a birthright that you gave us and you guys decided not to codify it and now it's poof it's basically gone."
- ★ Kirk suggested a pathway forward. "My wish for the left is that you'll become liberal again, and no longer leftist," he said. "Free speech is a liberal value. It is not a left-wing value."
- ★ He also pointed out the problem with restricting speech in a country

where voters select their leaders. When the other party takes over, as the Reform Party may be poised to do in the UK, "do you want Nigel Farage, prime minister, to be able to lock you up if you criticize his government? If your answer is no, then you have a moral obligation to make sure that your prime minister and the MPs advocate for a valuesneutral free speech policy. So regardless of who is in power in this country, you guys can challenge and you guys can speak openly. That is the bedrock of a liberal democracy."

Thank you, Charlie. Rest in peace.

How Outrage at Kimmel Grew to a Shout From a Whisper

Right-wing users on social media on Tuesday were frustrated but not yet apoplectic about Jimmy Kimmel's monologue. Things changed.



One of the first posts on X to share a clip from Mr. Kimmel's monologue came from Alex Christy, a staff writer for NewsBusters, a <u>conservative</u> <u>publication</u> that reports on mainstream media with the goal of "exposing and neutralizing liberal media bias," according to its website.

That post was published at 9:02 a.m. on Tuesday and gained steam slowly over the coming days as it ricocheted among social media users and across video platforms. The post ultimately gained more than 15 million views on X. It was amblified by too users there including Mr. Musk.

NewsBusters is a publication from the Media Research Center, a media watchdog and nonprofit founded in 1987 by L. Brent Bozell III, a conservative media critic who was also nominated this year by Mr. Trump to be the next ambassador to South Africa. The M.R.C. has repeatedly campaigned against mainstream media in a bid to have shows canceled or networks boycotted.



The New York Times credited MRC's Alex Christy for Jimmy Kimmel's "indefinite suspension" after Christy's video post of Kimmel's insensitive and deceitful remark about Charlie Kirk racked up 15 million views online, including a comment from Elon Musk: "Jimmy Kimmel is disgusting."

In addition! The New York Post devoted another portion of its cover and two-pages inside to highlight MRC's study on Jimmy Kimmel Live!, which found that the far-left host directed 92% of his political jabs at Trump and the GOP.

MRCTV's "Woke of the Weak" host Justine Brooke Murray joined Fox & Friends First in studio to discuss why young men are abandoning the Left in droves and finding a new home on the Right.

On *The View*, Whoopi and the panel found a way to blame Trump for the death of Ukrainian immigrant Iryna Zarutska, who was killed by a homeless vagrant who should have been in jail.

Then, in the next sentence, she proceeded to politicize it. "This is not political," Goldberg said. "This has to do with how we take care of our sick Americans when they are in need." She and Joy Behar then went on to blame President Trump for cutting research funding which had nothing to do with this case.

MRC's Tim Graham Calls Out the Media's Questionable Motives

Jimmy Kimmel got suspended indefinitely for saying that the man who shot Charlie Kirk was obviously "one of them" — referring to conservatives — when abundant evidence had emerged that the shooter was a radicalized leftist. But as MRC NewsBusters executive editor Tim Graham pointed out at the time, he was far from the only one to blame the right for what obviously was done by the left.

Graham pointed to Jonathan Lemire, who said on MSNBC that we knew little of the motives of the shooter (although we knew quite a lot) and that whatever they were, "they almost shouldn't matter because what happened here, it's a culture, a society where we've had this rise in political violence. We are awash in guns."



MSNBC co-host Jonathan Lemire, like many of his left-wing contemporaries, feigned ignorance of the motives of Charlie Kirk's shooter, a virulent leftist and Kirk hater.

John Dickerson, who said on *CBS*

Evening News Plus that "five days after Charlie Kirk's murder, the shooter's motive remains elusive. No writings left behind. Vague secondhand testimony." Graham wrote that when Dickerson said this, we knew the suspect was a leftist; we knew about the bullet casings with messages including "Hey fascist Catch."

Also on MSNBC, a former FBI agent, Chris O'Leary, claimed the shooter had a "salad bar ideology." Only if the salad bar were hate-fueled radical leftist ideology.



Even five days after Kirk's assassination, CBS's John Dickerson claimed the shooter's motives were "elusive."



MRC Calls Out Another Disgusting Take on Kirk's Assassin

ABC News *Special Report* gave Matt Gutman the responsibility for combing through the text messages between the man who killed Charlie Kirk and his live-in transitioning lover — and as MRC reported the results were ... on the bizarre side.

"I don't know if we have seen an alleged murder with such specific text messages about the alleged murder weapon — where it was hidden, how it was placed, what was on it, but also it was very touching in a way that I think many of us didn't expect," Gutman began.

"A very intimate portrait into this relationship between the suspect's roommate and the suspect himself, with him repeatedly calling his roommate, who is transitioning, calling my 'my love' and 'I want to protect you, my love."

But that wasn't all. Gutman waxed poetic about the contrasting imagery of assassination and love. "So it was the duality of someone who the attorney said not only jeopardized the life of Charlie Kirk and the crowd but was doing it in front of children, which is one of the aggravating circumstances of this case. And then, on the other hand, he was, you know, speaking so lovingly about his partner. So, a very interesting and, as Pierre [Thomas] said, riveting press conference."



After MRC reported on ABC News's Matt Gutman romanticizing a letter between Charlie Kirk's assassin and live-in transitioning boyfriend, numerous conservative media outlets and social media content creators picked up the story, including *The Daily Wire*.



Welcome to the Soros-Exposing Party, CRC

In September, the Capital Research Center released a report that showed George Soros and his family and organization had donated more than \$80 million to groups tied to terrorism or extremist violence.

Recipients of Soros's largesse included groups that helped train activists in property destruction and sabotage during the 2020 Black Lives Matter riots and the Sunrise Movement, a climate-obsessed group that endorsed the Antifa-linked Stop Cop City campaign, which has led to more than 40 domestic terrorism charges and 60 racketeering indictments.

CRC's Ryan Mauro connected the Soros family to not only US-based terrorism but to terrorism in the Middle East as well. Mauro found that Soros funneled more than \$2.3 million to Al-Haq, a non-governmental organization based in the West Bank and long accused of ties to the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine, which both the US and EU designate as a terrorist organization.

If any of this sounds familiar, it should. MRC has been documenting and reporting on Soros's dirty dealings for years. Shortly after the Oct. 7, 2023, attacks in Israel, MRC exposed how the Middle East connections of Soros-funded groups openly celebrated the massacre of hundreds of Israeli citizens. MRC Founder and then-President Brent Bozell co-wrote a letter demanding the Soros family expose its ties to pro-Hamas groups, publicly disavow them and terminate all funding.

As MRC VP Dan Schneider said on One America News in 2023, the Soros family has "taken over the evil empire ... have defined the enemy and the enemy is Israel. They have, in word and deed, consistently supported Hamas and Hezbollah against the Jewish state."
